A "REAL" Christmas Carol

Everybody loves *A Christmas Carol*. It is a Christmas classic. Ebeneezer Scrooge and Bob Cratchit and the Ghosts of Christmas Past, Present, and Future. Written by Charles Dickens in 1843, *A Christmas Carol* truly has changed the way we celebrate Christmas for two hundred years. You see, in England at the time, Christmas was considered a minor holiday, at best. In fact, many of the traditions that we associate with Christmas were made popular by Dickens' story. Someone must have truly led a sheltered existence indeed to not recognize phrases like, "Bah. Humbug!", "Christmas. A fine excuse for picking a man's pocket every twenty-fifth of December!", and "God bless us, Every One!" Yes, *A Christmas Carol* is firmly embedded in our cultural understanding of Christmas, and it has been for quite some time.

If one desires to celebrate Christmas for its true meaning, however, this wonderful little tale leaves something to be desired. Now, don't get me wrong, I love *A Christmas Carol*. I read it every year and watch several of the theatrical adaptations of it. My favorite movie account of the story is the 2009 version starring Jim Carrey as old Scrooge. I am also very fond of "Mickey's Christmas Carol." But again, my fondness for the story doesn't make up for the fact that it is unbiblical in many ways. According to Holy Scripture, for example, there are no such things as ghosts. Additionally, and most significantly, Scrooge's problems and impending doom were not simply the result of him being a mean and selfish old man. Scrooge's problem was and is humanity's problem.... sin. Charles Dickens presents this issue in a way that suggests if Scrooge – and the rest of us – would just be kind to our fellow

man, we would be keeping Christmas well. Yet we Scrooges of the world cannot simply fix our moral dilemmas by striving to be better people. We can't cheat death by having a change of heart. No, the solution to our problems – all of them – is Christmas.... the true and real meaning of Christmas.

This Advent we will be using the story of Ebeneezer Scrooge, Bob Cratchit, the Spirits, and Tiny Tim, to focus on our real need for Christmas. By way of Advent Devotions, and our Wednesday evenings together we will be re-evaluating *A Christmas Carol*. We will be looking at the story from a biblical perspective. And in doing so, I pray you come to cherish this story – if you don't already – and begin to see it in a different light. Join us this Advent as we explore "A 'REAL' Christmas Carol." A blessed Advent and a Merry Christmas everybody! Or, as Tiny Tim would say, "God Bless us, Every One! In Christ.

We've had a good supply of donated items. These are sorted, checked for appropriateness, cleanliness, etc; and sometimes washed. Labeled boxes are packed. Packing beautiful quilts-baby to adult size as well as the cute pillowcase dresses really makes us smile. The 53-foot



semi is expected to load our pallets of boxes during the week of Thanksgiving. More volunteers have come to pack Mercy Meals. 19,304 rice-fortified meals were packed in October and November.
